Message from the Minister

My Dear Friends

I am delighted to present the Cairnshill Methodist Church Annual Report for 2011.

The year began with three new members joining the Church Council for a three year term of office as Congregational Representatives – Sharon Irvine, Arlene Irvine and Duncan Burnett. We are very grateful to Paddy Abbott, Jennifer McMaster and Ruth Johnston for many years service in the Church Council who all stood down in 2010, Ruth having served as Council Secretary.

Last year saw two major fund raising appeals. Pearl's appeal for the 'Door of Hope' in Johannesburg closed in April having raised about £3k. This was a project Brenda and I were privileged to visit during our trip to South Africa last year. You can be assured that the funds for this project are being well used. We began fundraising in September for another project I visited in SA; the Phakamisa Project. As I write now, this project is coming close to meeting its target of £5k. An excellent effort all round

The pulpit exchange between Andrew Robinson from Hillcrest Methodist near Durban and me was a great blessing to us both, and I trust, to the churches involved. I thank the people of Cairnshill for supporting and allowing this exchange to take place, and to thank you for the welcome and support that was offered to Andrew.

Our new church website was launched in September. The primary purpose of the website is to keep the people of our church informed of what is happening; in the church, in our Circuit and in the wider body of Christ. The website calendar is an important tool for planning church events and booking rooms. There is great potential for the website to grow as a means of keeping ourselves informed of what is happening in the church and to communicate amongst ourselves.

This report gives a taste of a number of activities going on within the church. I am sure you will find it informative. There are many other

groups and events which are not included but which are an important part of our mission and life of Service for our Lord.

Mission should always be the primary focus of our church life. Property and Finance are important, but they are resources for mission not ends in themselves. However, we still have a responsibility for good stewardship of both these areas of church life. 2011 has been a challenging year for property and finance. The beginning of the year saw extreme cold weather and associated damage caused by burst pipes and frost damage to walls, slabs and roof tiles. Grateful thanks ought to go especially to our Property Steward Arlene Haslett for coordinating emergency and other repairs to the damage caused. Maureen Thompson worked with the Insurance Company to recover some of the costs. Les Drew and his lads replaced some of the exterior lighting much improving the situation for us, particularly in the winter. We continue to be grateful for the team of men, Joe, David and Kenny in particular, who quietly go about maintaining the grounds. Thanks also to John Johnston who spend many hours inside the building with a paintbrush in his hand doing much to lift the decor.

In common with many other churches, finances are going through a tight patch. Giving took a hit in 2011– the figures on page 16 and graphs on page 18 show the degree of this, while expenses continue to rise. Gift Aid showed a mark drop. Gift Aid is a difficult thing to accurately compare from year to year. Depending on whether payments from the tax office are on time or delayed might mean only receiving three quarterly payments through the books one year while other years there are five quarterly payments. Gift Aid giving however is an important income stream for the church. If you are a UK tax payer you can Gift Aid your giving at no additional expanse to yourself. As I write this, activities are starting to wind down for the end of the Church year. Please pray for our church and all who are involved in serving the Lord through it. May the the Lord Bless you all.

MWI Report - January - December 2011

On 26 January we started with our Visitors' Night. Mr Raymond King came to tell his story about being shipwrecked in Antarctic in 2007. We collected £150 and gave half to Oxfam and half to the Children's Hospice in Kiladeas, Co Fermanagh.

February 9th was our next meeting. Mrs Heather Gunning gave a presentation about her missionary work in the Far East. It was very informative and enjoyable and the meeting was well attended with several visitors from within our congregation. We then enjoyed a nice cup of tea/coffee afterwards.

Our annual MWI Service was held on Sunday, 13 February and Mrs Margaret Weir, All Ireland President was the speaker. Margaret also spoke to the children before they went out to Sunday School and they all seemed to enjoy it.

The"Handbag Fairy" could not make it on 23 February but Ivie Jamison very kindly helped us out and gave a talk on reflexology and told us about how different parts of the feet, hands and ears are connected to our internal organs.

Next, on 4 March we had the Women's World Day of Prayer in Cairnshill. There was a reasonable turnout and we had a cup of tea afterwards.

Eric Clarke was due to speak to us on 9 March. This had to be cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances. He is visiting us on 23 March instead. We had a bit of fun with a beetle drive instead! Eric Clarke made it to our next meeting on 23 March and gave a very interesting presentation on Nigeria and how easy it is to save the sight of people with cataracts and just how grateful these people are afterwards. It is something that we in a richer part of the world take almost for granted.

We all travelled to Donaghadee on 13 April to visit the Royal National Lifeboat Institution. Mr Alan Couser gave a talk for almost one hour, explaining the work of the RNLI. It was interesting to us all and gave an insight into "behind the scenes". Afterwards, Brenda, our President, invited us back to the Manse where we had a lovely supper and lots of chat. This was the final meeting of the 2010/2011 Session.

Our new 2011/2012 Session started on 28 September. Brenda gave a presentation on the time she and Colin visited South Africa in early summer 2011. It was lovely to hear reports about the locals and see photographs of Hillcrest Methodist Church etc.

On 13 October we again hosted, in Cairnshill, the Belfast District Autumn Rally. Sandra Dixon spoke about the World Assembly in Johannesburg and accompanied it with photographs.

On 26 October, Lizz Glendinning was to have been our speaker on Paper Craft. Unfortunately, Lizz was ill and had to cancel at the last minute. We quickly organised a quiz among ourselves.

The AGM and Box Opening were held on 9 November 2011. Sam Campbell from the Resource Centre at Edgehill came to our meeting on 23 November to show us the "Christmas Box" and how he uses it to demonstrate the true meaning of Christmas. He explained how the idea of it started when his children were very young and the tradition is still carried on.

On 14 December we arranged an outing to Ulster Folk and Transport Museum, Cultra for an evening of traditional music. It was held in one of the old churches on the museum site and was in fact being recorded by RTE radio for broadcasting in the New Year. Tea, coffee and mince pies were served during the interval.

Seven leaders are not enough to cope with the amount of children we have and therefore the Duke of Ed helpers are vital to the running of the Youth Club.

Finally, I would ask that you remember the Youth Club and all the leaders/helpers in your prayers that we may continue to flourish and grow from strength to strength with God's guidance.

Youth Club 2011-12 (The Vibe)

The Youth Club at Cairnshill known to the members as, THE VIBE continues to thrive under the joint leadership of Cairnshill Methodist and Saintfield Road Presbyterian Churches. The junior club operates from 6.30 to 7.45 every Friday for children age 6 to 11. The junior club has continued to flourish this year with weekly attendances being regularly in the high sixties and on a few occasions even over seventy. The senior club catering for 12 to 17 year olds also meets on Friday nights running from 8.00 to 10.00. The membership in the senior club has declined a little this year but we still see forty to fifty teenagers ever Friday night.

On a typical night at 'The Vibe', members engage in a range of activities which include; enjoying chatting to their friends in the coffee bar, 5-A-side football, unihoc, volleyball, electronic games as well as traditional board games, snooker, table football, air hockey and much more besides. We also run a very full arts programme which is particularly popular with the girls. Every club night at the youth club is underpinned by our, 'Centre Spot' or 'Take 5' slot, during which we present the challenge of the Christian faith in a way which is appreciated and understood by the young people. We are grateful to the volunteers who help with the Centre Spot/Take 5 presentations for the Junior Club and to the willing band of leaders who engage with the teenagers in our Senior Club.

As well as the regular activities which take place on a Friday evening members have the opportunity to sign up for and enjoy special events. This year members had the opportunity to adventure out to The Belfast Activity Centre to experience caving and climbing, enjoy sea fishing off the coast at Bangor, test their skills at Laser Quest and during the summer holidays football sessions were organised to help keep them occupied. The members of the Senior Club continued their great efforts of fundraising during the year. One thousand pounds was raised for the Oyugis project and the Club continued their sponsorship for Seynabou a ten year old girl who lives in Mali. As well as sponsoring Seynabou members also write to her and send cards at Christmas and on her birthday. Members also raised funds to support the 'Twin a Toilet' project run by Save the Children.

As a church we owe a great debt of gratitude to our dedicated band of young and in some cases, not so young, band of dedicated leaders. It is particularly impressive to see our young leaders meet 30 minutes before the start of the club to discuss the programme for the night, highlight any problems which need attention and pray for the members and their families. At the end of the night's activities the leaders meet again to discuss how the evening has gone and how best we can meet the needs of the members of the club.

As always it has been a hectic but rewarding year and we appreciate the support given by both churches. Please continue to support the work of 'The Vibe' in your thoughts and prayers. We look forward to the year ahead seeking to serve God as we cater for the young people of our area at THE VIBE every Friday Night. Members of both congregations are welcome to drop in any Friday night and see the club at work.




